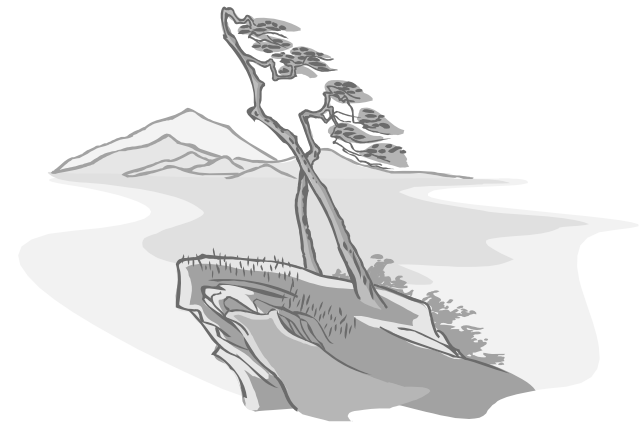

### **Purpose**

The term *Borderline* has been applied inconsistently historically and even today it is not clear whether borderline personality refers to a distinct personality syndrome, a particular type of affective dysregulation, a level of personality organization, or some combination of these. Whatever the case, the borderline personality is a clinical syndrome surrounded by a certain mystique, and nearly every clinician in the behavioral health field will encounter examples of this fascinating and sometimes baffling and frustrating disorder. Few of us are specifically prepared to engage in therapy of the borderline personality itself, but an understanding of the disorder is essential to successfully managing the person within the scope of our own practice. This presentation will focus on an overview of the borderline syndrome and will provide practical strategies for management of the borderline in the context of substance abuse or general mental health work.

### **Objectives**

At the completion of this workshop participants will be able to:

- ◆ Understand the overlap and distinction between the categorical/descriptive approach to diagnosis used in the DSM-IV and theoretical approaches to the disorder.
- ◆ Be able to recognize the essential presenting features of borderline personality in clinical practice.
- ◆ Use this knowledge as a basis for developing practical strategies to engage and work with the borderline patient within the participant's own scope of practice.
